Community Health Needs Assessment

Not-for-profit hospitals and health systems are required by the Affordable Care Act to conduct a community health needs assessment (CHNA) every three years. The 2018-2021 CHNA was conducted as a collaborative multi-stage process that combined broad subjective and qualitative community input; a complete assessment using quantifiable data, consultation with government leaders with current data and/or other information relevant to the health needs of the community served by Lakeland Regional Health; and consultation with those with special knowledge or expertise in public health to determine and subsequently prioritize community health needs.

The 2018-2021 CHNA identified 7 priority health needs:

- Heart Disease and Stroke Screening • Maternal and Infant Care
- Access to Quality, Coordinated Care Injury Prevention
- Mental Healthcare
